### **COVID-19 NOTICE**

Our summer camp's operating procedures during COVID-19 will be consistent with CDC guidelines. All children are required to wash their hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer before entering the program. All children are required to wear a face mask when indoors, except while eating or drinking. Children may remove their mask outdoors when social distancing can be maintained. Staff are required to follow CDC and IDPH guidelines regarding the wearing of masks. Due to IDPH Guidelines, all water fountains in the YMCA are turned off and out of order. Camp staff will refill campers' water bottles from sealed Hinckley Springs water dispensers. Childcare staff have been trained extensively on CDC and IDPH guidelines regarding cleaning and sanitization. The YMCA is utilizing a contact-free drop off and pick up routine to maintain social distance among parents and capers. Upon arrival, Upon arrival, staff will perform a symptom screener prior to the camper exiting the vehicle.
